Who are Berkeley's Digital Leaders?

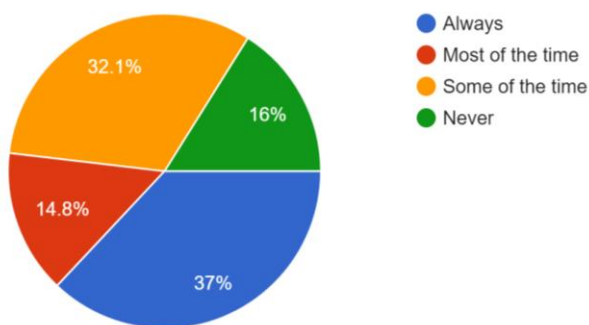
We are a group of Year 5 and 6 children who help to keep people safe on the internet and use technology well. We did a survey of almost 90 KS2 pupils about who they talk to online and what games they play.

Do you know what your child is doing online?

35% of pupils aren't sure or don't think that their parents know who they are talking to. 52.9% of children think that their parents don't always know what they do online: 16% say their parents never check on them.

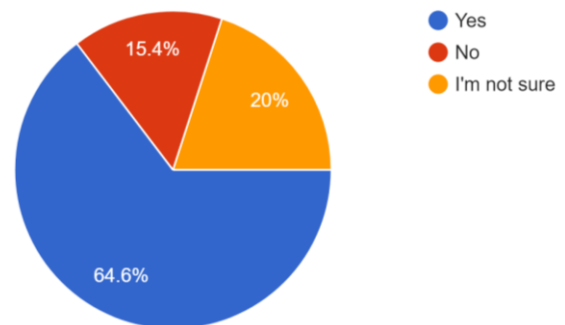
Do your parents monitor (check up on) what you play on/ go on?

65 responses

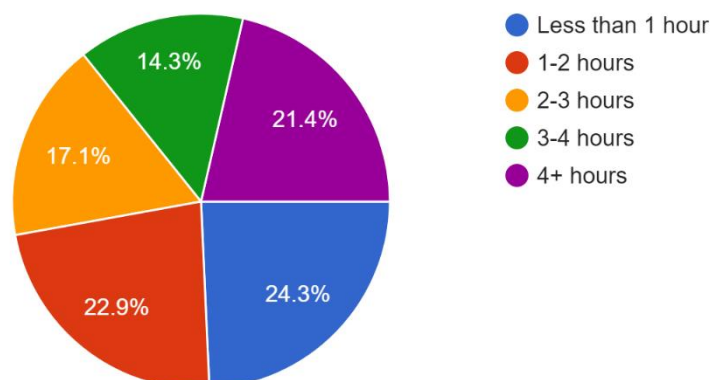


How long is your child online?

Because our questionnaire asked for honest opinions, we believe that over 35% of children play for over three hours a day.

How long do you spend gaming per day?

70 responses



Age Ratings

The majority of Year 6 children reported that they play on games rated 18, whilst many Year 4 children said they played on 12 and 16 rated games with a few stating they play 18 rated games.
