What is Bullying?

Bullying is when someone hurts, upsets or frightens someone **more than once on purpose**.



Bullying can be ...

Emotional: Hurting someone's feelings, leaving them out, bossing someone around, nasty looks, spreading gossip.

Physical: Punching, kicking, spitting, hitting, pushing.

3rd person: One person sending another person to say nasty things or physically hurt someone.

Verbal: Being teased, name calling, hand signs, laughing at you, making fun of you.

Homophobic: Calling you names based on gender or sexuality.

Sexist: Calling you names because of your sex (boy or girl).

Racist: Calling you racist names, making fun of your religion or culture.

Cyber: texts, e-mail, social media, games.

EVERYONE IS DIFFERENT

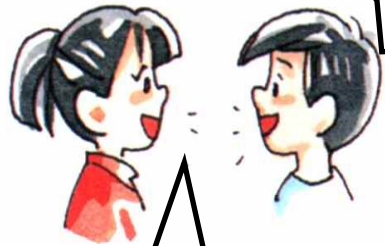
At Berkeley Primary School:
