

REVIEW AND REFLECTION ON 2024/2025

Key Achievements to date: 24/25

- TF (PE Pioneer lead for the authority) and has led several meeting of PE leads from other schools to improve our practise.
- Drop in observations show that staff confidence in delivering PE lessons continues to rise and therefore the quality,delivery and engagement of the children in the 'Get Set 4 PE' curriculum is high.
- Pupil Survey showed that 100% (of children surveyed) really enjoy the P.E. lessons that they are in.
- The school has entered Inter school competitions across a range of sporting areas. These include: Cross Country, Athletics (Sportshall, EIS & Quad Kids inc Y1/2), Football (3/4, 5/6 and girls), Tag rugby, Swimming, Do Yourself Proud, Girls Games Day, Dance, Ten-pin bowling, New age Kurling
- Winners of: Sportshall Athletics for 5/6 and Year 3/4 Quad Kids (N.Lincs and Humber Champions)
- Inclusive sports teams competed at Regional events (New age Kurling)
- OPAL (Outdoor Play and Learning) was introduced in the Summer term to promote active breaktimes and lunchtimes. The impact has been significant and the children are engaged in a multitude of different activities, not all sport based.
- Six sports days successfully completed. Sports Day format continued as previous year so all children have up to 6 races/events. Y1/2 have a carousel of activities supported by Y6 children.
- The sports premium is reviewed termly and any purchases considered are done so in order to improve the quality and provision of all lessons as well as promote PE within the school.
- PE and sporting achievements are celebrated in P.E. Children are spoken about and celebrated in assemblies and rewarded with Dojos
- School website and Class Dojo is continuously updated to give regular updates on P.E.
- 'Get Set 4 PE' curriculum continues to be a success. Agreed to be bought into for a further 3 years
- Resources have been considered and with consultation with members of staff, purchased to aid the delivery of high quality PE from Foundation to KS2.
- At school we have maintained the varied offer of sports to the students, catering for as many children as is available across a broad spectrum of disciplines. This also included all children in Y6 taking part in the Orienteering event at Brumby Hall.
- All 3 Y2 classes went to separate sporting events hosted by the 'Get Ahead Partnership'
- Sports Presentation assembly organised for 15/7/25 celebrating achievements of children in P.E. and sports across all Key Stages. This format has changed

Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

- Ensure a more clear progression is evident year on year through subject analysis, pupil interviews, teacher feedback and observations.
- Ensure all staff have a good understanding of assessment criteria.
- Through P.E. staff meetings, ensure staff have improved subject knowledge and understand how to ensure children are achieving their success criteria.
- More frequent lesson observations of KS1 and KS2 PE.
- Targets and objectives to be made clear to children in PE lessons, monitored through lesson observations and assessments (Ensure these are shared)
- To extend the number of clubs offered to children, whether they are provided through employed staff or external agencies.
- Earlier organisation of intra-school competitions (especially in KS1)
- Improve children's use of sport specific vocabulary
- Children need to understand how skills learnt in PE can be linked across the entire PE curriculum.
- Ensure staff are revisiting previous learning to ensure skills and vocabulary are embedded.
